PURPOSE AND ORGANIZATION

PURPOSE

CORE COLLECTIONS is designed to serve a number of purposes:

As an aid in purchasing. Core Collections is designed to assist in the selection and ordering of titles. Summaries and evaluative excerpts are provided for each title along with information regarding the publisher, ISBN, page count, grade level, and publication year. In evaluating the suitability of a work, each library will want to consider the needs of the unique patron base it serves.

As an aid in verification of information. For this purpose, bibliographical information is provided in the Classified Collection. Entries also include recommended subject headings based on NoveList's proprietary subject vocabulary. Notes may describe editions available and other content; for the most up-to-date metadata, please consult the EBSCOhost database.

As an aid in curriculum or programming support. The classified approach, subject indexing, annotations, and evaluative excerpts are helpful in identifying materials appropriate for classroom support, for book discussions, and other programming.

As an aid in collection maintenance. Information about titles available on a subject facilitates decisions to rebind, replace, or discard items. If a book has been demoted to the *Supplemental* or *Weeded* recommendation levels and therefore no longer appears in the print abridgment of the database, that demotion is not intended as a sign that the book is no longer valuable or that it should necessarily be weeded from your library's collection.

As an aid in professional development or instruction. The Core Collection is useful in courses or professional training that deal with collection development and readers' advisory; it may also be used in course that deal with literature and book selection, especially in the creation of bibliographies and reading lists.

As an aid to readers' advisory. Every title in this Core Collection is a recommended work and can be given with confidence to a user who expresses a need based on topic, genre, etc. Readers' advisory and user service are further aided by series and awards information, by the descriptive summaries and evaluative excerpts from trusted review sources, and by the subject headings in the Title and Subject Index applied by professional metadata librarians at NoveList.

ORGANIZATION

CHILDREN'S CORE COLLECTION is presented in a single volume. As in previous editions, the CHILDREN'S CORE COLLECTION contains graphic novels: most fiction graphic novels can be found in 741.5, while most nonfiction graphic novels are found either in the biography section (B) or under specific Dewey headings.

This Core Collection is organized into two parts: a Classified Collection and an Author, Title, Series, and Subject Index.

CHILDREN'S CORE COLLECTION Twenty-sixth Edition

Part 1. Classified Collection

The Classified Collection is arranged with nonfiction books first, classified according to the Dewey Decimal Classification in numerical order from 000 to 999. Individual biographies are classed at B and follow the Dewey Classified section. Two sections follow the biographies: Easy Books (E), consisting primarily of picture books of interest to children from preschool to grade three; and Fiction (Fic). Within classes, works are arranged alphabetically under the main entry, usually the author. Biographies are arranged alphabetically under the biography's subject.

An Outline of Classification, which serves as a table of contents for the Classified Collection, is reproduced following this explanation. It should be noted that many topics can be classified in more than one discipline. If a particular title is not found where it might be expected, the Index should be consulted to determine if it is classed elsewhere.

The information supplied for each book includes a bibliographic description, suggested subject headings, and, where relevant, series names and publication history. Subject headings are derived from NoveList's extensive curated vocabulary. Also included is a suggested classification number from the *Abridged Dewey Decimal Classification and Relative Index*. Whenever possible, a summary and an evaluative excerpt from a quoted source are also included. The following is an example of a typical entry and a description of its components.

The star at the start of the title indicates that this is an *Essential* title. The name of the author, Jim Murphy, is given in conformity with Library of Congress Authorities. The title of the book is *An American Plague: The True and Terrifying Story of the Yellow Fever Epidemic of 1793*. The book was published by Clarion Books in 2003, and contains 165 pages. If it were part of a series, the series name would follow the page count. The book is recommended for any of the following grade levels: 5 6 7 8.

At the end of the last line in the body entry is the figure 614.5 in bold face type. This is the classification number derived from the Abridged Dewey Decimal Classification. The number 614.5 is the classification number for "Incidence of and public measures to prevent specific diseases and kinds of diseases."

The numbered terms "1. Sick persons," etc. are recommended subject headings for this book based on NoveList's database of subject headings. An ISBN (International Standard Book Number) is included to facilitate ordering; however, there will often be many editions and formats of a given title; due to space constraints these ISBNs are not provided in the print edition, though many can be found in the corresponding database. The Library of Congress control number is provided when available.

Next are the awards this title has won, followed by an evaluative excerpt from a critical reviewing source, in this case *Horn Book*. Such summaries and excerpts are useful in evaluating books for selection and in determining which of several books on the same subject is best suited for the individual reader or purchasing library. Notes are also made to describe special features, such as publication history, film adaptations, or series order. In this case, the presence of bibliographic references and an index is noted.

Part 2. Author, Title, Series, and Subject Index

The author, title, series, and subject index is a single alphabetical list of all the books entered in the Core Collection. Each book can be found under their author entry, title, series, and subjects. The classification number is the key to the location of the main entry for the book in the Classified Collection.
