The contested area concerns six nations, one-third of global maritime traffic, untapped oil and natural gas reserves, military buildup and 5 trillion dollars' worth of trade. The volume explores the economic, diplomatic, military, and environmental impact of resolving this conflict.

Alternative Facts, Post-Truth & The Information War: explores news consumption and media manipulation, including selective curation of news stories and the lack of a shared news narrative. It examines the effect of internet subcultures that manipulate news feeds, set agendas and push ideas forward. Furthermore, it investigates internet media's dependence on trending analytics and metrics, sensationalism of headlines and advertising driven models of news publishing. Finally it explores the negative effect of public consumption of false or misleading news.

*National Debate Topic 2018/2019: Immigration*: The focus of this issue is Immigration, the subject of the National Forensics League's (NFL) 2018-2019 Policy Debate. It examines current trends in immigration policy and collects a variety of thought pieces on the issue of immigration. Among the topics explored are: the future of DACA and Dreamers, the merits of the proposed border wall along the southern US, the travel ban and its legitimacy and the refugee crisis. Also discussed will be the H-1 b visa under the Trump administration, the foreign-born technology class and the idea of the American melting pot.

Artificial Intelligence: explores the latest thinking around the ethics and governance of Artificial Intelligence. Where will robots make the most useful impact in society? As computers become more adept at mimicking human behavior and problem solving, what issues will be solved or created by new forms of artificial intelligence? It covers the scientific, economic and social implications of advanced artificial intelligence systems in human life.

*The American Dream*: explores the sturdiness of this idea of The American Dream in 2018. Is the American dream of upward mobility accessible in a society so fragmented and economically unequal? Does the American Dream still exist in a country experiencing an anti-immigration trend? Have economic policies had an impact on American striving? This issue explores the relationship between education and jobs, technological displacement of workers, downward mobility among certain groups, labor mobility and home ownership as indicators of the health of the idea of the American Dream.

**Representative American Speeches 2017-2018**: Selected from a wide range of speakers and venues, this issue will offer some of the most engaging American speeches of the year. Distinguished by its diversity, covering areas in politics, education, popular culture, as well as trending topics in the news, these speeches provide an interesting format to explore some of the year's most important stories.
